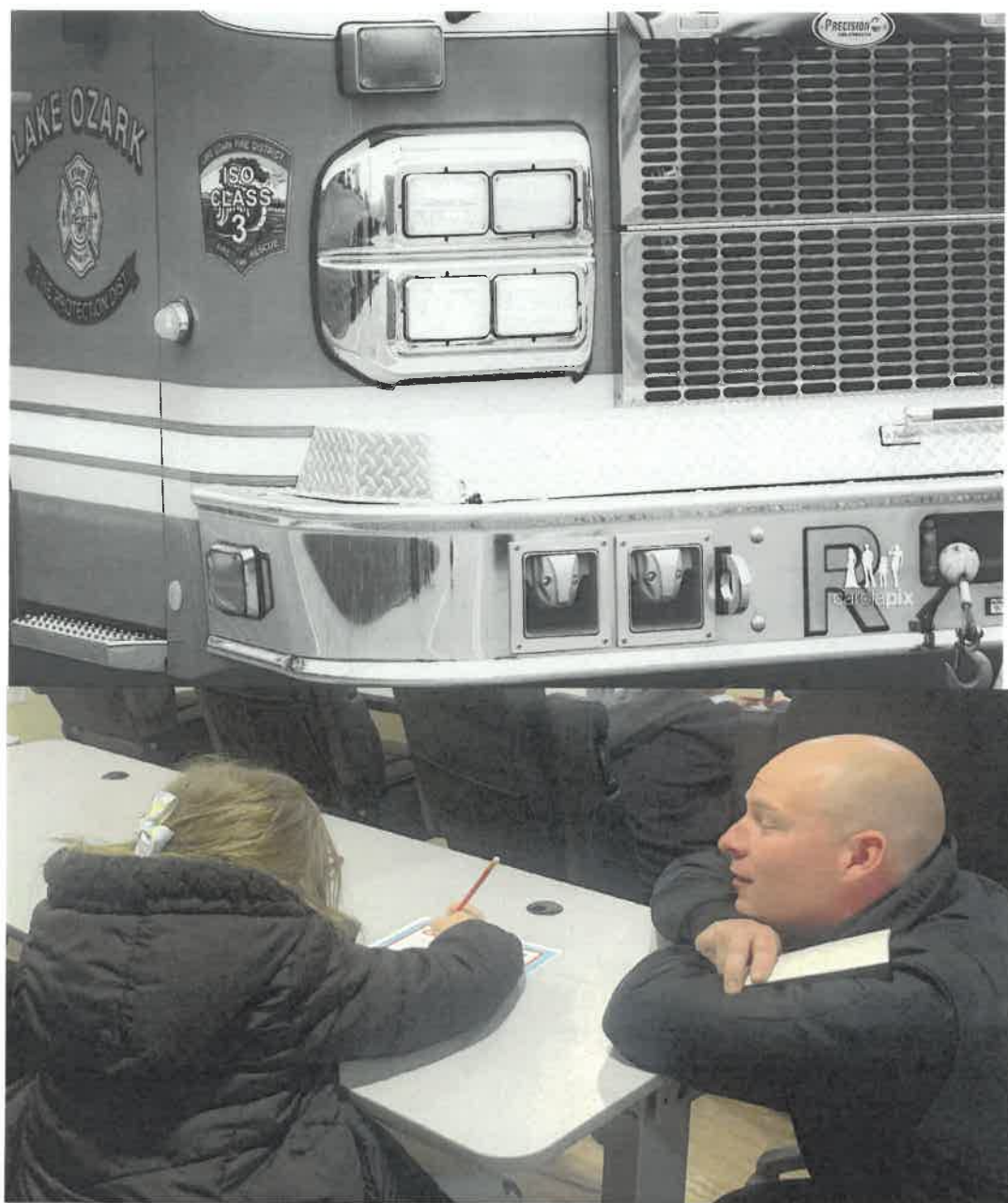

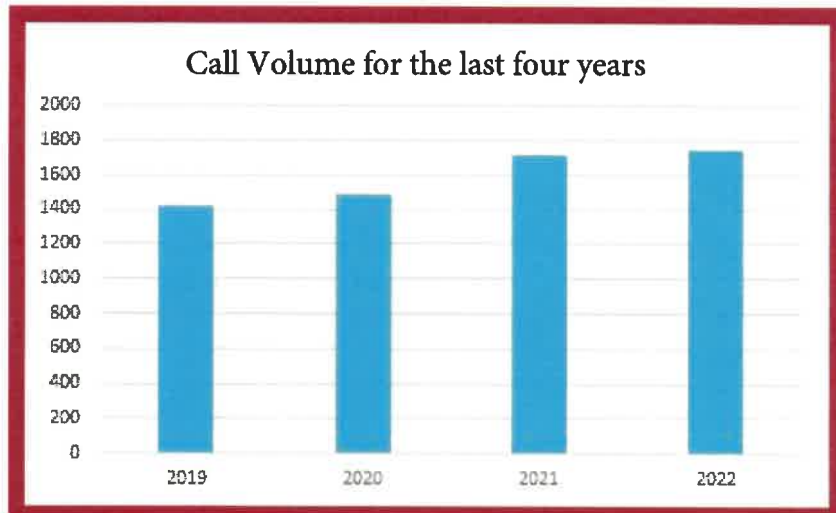
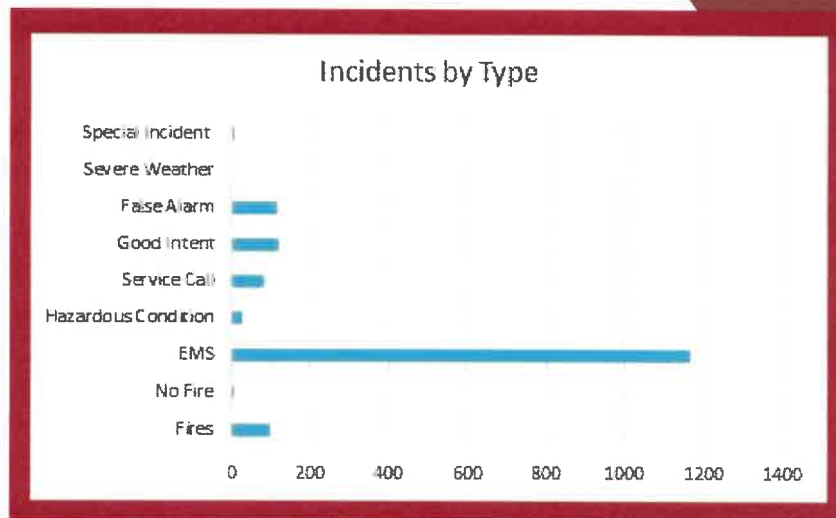

Shane Merrill has helped coach the Osage Wrestling Club for the last seven years.



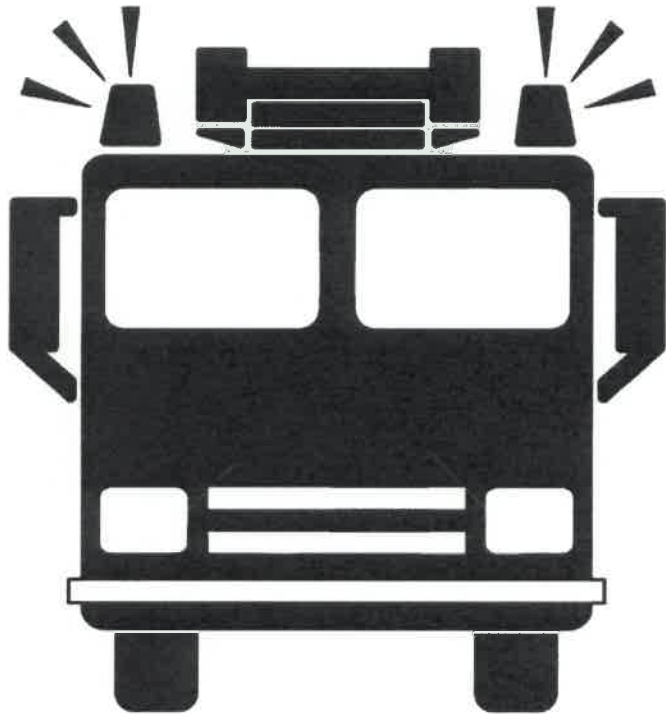
Adam Rowher helps coach youth baseball and football.

Shawn Merrill has volunteered four weeks a year for the last 12 yrs with the Boy Scout's of America.



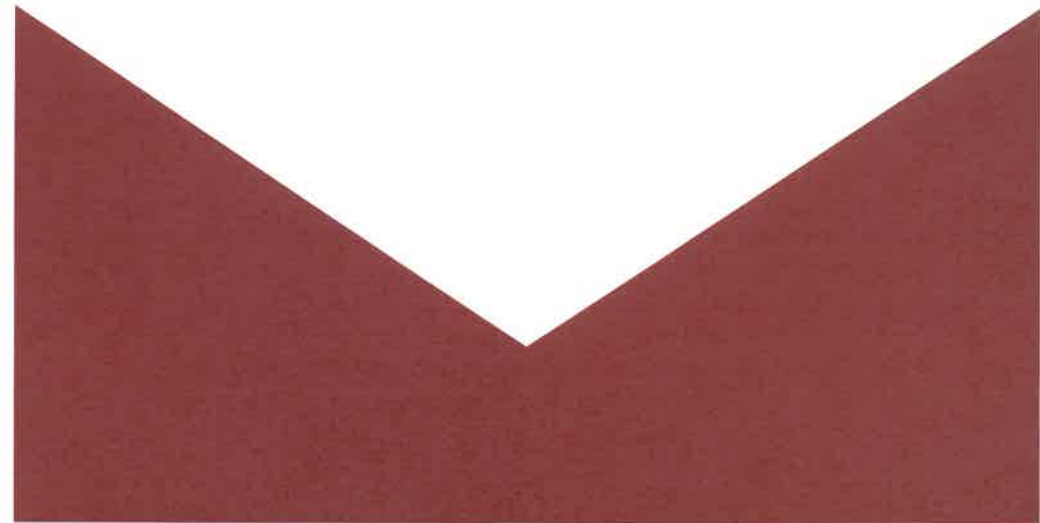
***Average Turnout Time
